



10 Important Facts About Adobe Software Licensing

1. Licensed upgrades are not additional licenses for a full product. You need to own the license for a prior full version in order to use an upgrade.
2. Burning copies of software on CDs is not permitted.
3. Backup copies cannot be used unless the original software is destroyed, and simultaneous home and office use of a product requires two licenses.
4. You must be licensed to use any software font provided to you by a client or anyone else.
5. Anyone may download the FREE Adobe® Acrobat® Reader® software, but use of the full versions of the Acrobat product family require a valid license.
6. Any user with access to software on a corporate server must be licensed to use that product.
7. Concurrent use of software is generally not allowed—all individuals who have access to the products must have valid licenses to use them.
8. Extended licensing of older software for backwards compatibility is generally not allowed, except on a case-by-case basis in transition situations.
9. Multiple copies of software on a single machine require multiple licenses, including different versions of the same software.
10. Site licenses specifically define a “site” and do not permit broader use. Thus, selling or transferring excess licenses beyond the defined site is not permitted.
