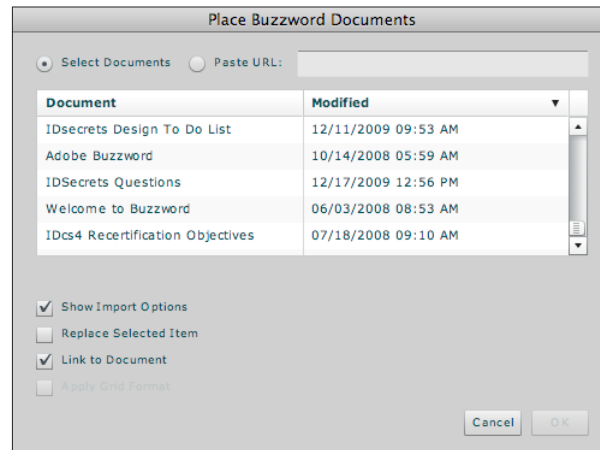

Volume 3: Production helpers

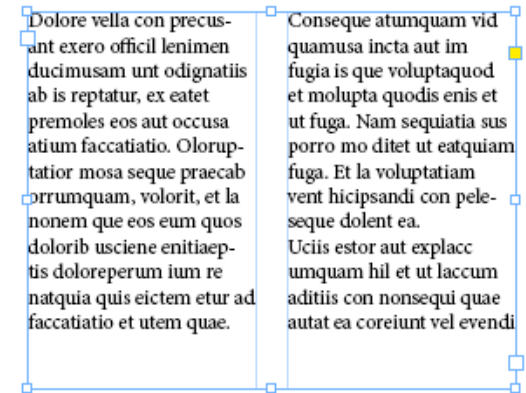
Sometimes it's the "small" features that make the biggest difference and save you the most time. For example, InDesign CS5 now lets you apply stroke and fill from the Control panel, import and export Acrobat.com Buzzword® documents, balance columns in multicolumn frames automatically, and zoom while dialog boxes are open.



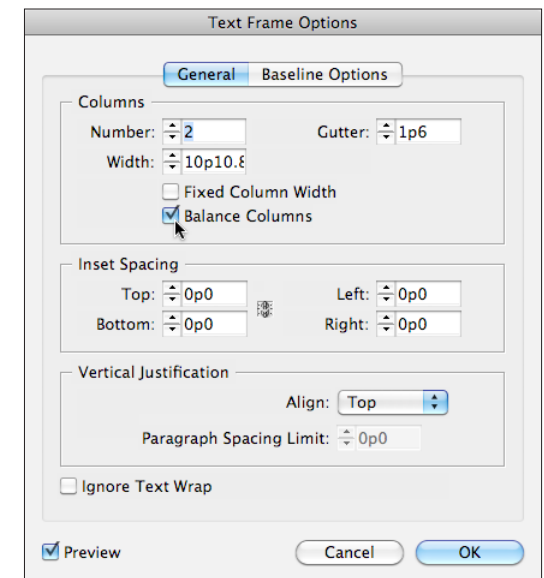
1 To save screen real estate, keep your Swatches panel closed and use the Fill and Stroke widgets in the Control panel instead. Click the triangle to the right of the preview square to view all your document swatches. Or Shift-click to display the Colors panel for quick color modifications.



2 If you use Buzzword on Acrobat.com, you'll love the ability to import or export documents directly by choosing File > Place From Buzzword or File > Export For > Buzzword.



3 When text does not fill a multicolumn text frame, the last column of text is often far shorter than the others. You can fix this by choosing Object > Text Frame Options and selecting Balance Columns. InDesign attempts to align the columns by adding extra space.



4 Even when dialog boxes are open, you can change the view magnification of your document by holding down the Command key (Mac OS) or Ctrl key (Windows®) and pressing + or - (plus or minus).
