Adobe Supplier Platform Change

Adobe Supplier,

Thank you for your continued partnership. We are writing to share an update on Adobe's transition from graphiteConnect to GEP Quantum, which will take place **June 8, 2026**.

This transition supports Adobe's goal of strengthening collaboration, improving process efficiency, and creating a more streamlined procurement experience for both suppliers and internal teams.

We are committed to supporting you throughout this change. While transitions take time, our team will provide clear guidance and resources along the way. The information below outlines the actions we are asking you to take now to prepare.

Actions to Prepare for This Transition:

To support a smooth transition and data migration, please complete the following **by May 11, 2026**:

- **Review and update your profile in graphiteConnect** and complete any in-progress onboarding or risk forms. This helps ensure your most up-to-date information is migrated to GEP Quantum. After this date, new risk assessments or profile changes will not be available in graphiteConnect after GEP Quantum launches.
- **Complete open or in-progress contracts**, including new requests, amendments, and renewals, where possible.

What to Expect Next:

- **Starting June 10, 2026:** We will host training sessions to guide you through the registration process and how to navigate the platform. *Four sessions will be offered, and you only need to attend one. Training invitations will be sent by **mid-May**.*
- **Starting June 11, 2026:** While we will launch GEP Quantum on June 8, supplier registration forms will be distributed starting June 11. You must register in GEP Quantum to engage with Adobe for onboarding, sourcing and contracting activities, profile updates, and risk form submissions moving forward.

***Note:** *Ariba will continue to be used for purchase orders and invoicing.*
