Getting more out of Adobe Creative Cloud

With Named User Licensing, the Adobe Creative Cloud licenses are tied to individual faculty and staff, not serial numbers or computers. That means that users can take advantage of more of the Adobe Creative Cloud apps and services without asking for the IT Services team to install any software. Faculty and staff gain the flexibility to use apps on any device, or even use mobile apps through their personal mobile devices.

For the IT Services team, Named User Licensing makes managing licenses much easier and faster. Licenses are tied directly to email addresses in the Active Directory. When new personnel enter the system, it automatically provisions the proper licenses according to the user's group membership. Automatic provisioning not only reduces time spent monitoring and distributing licenses, but it also helps PSU maintain licensing compliance with little effort.
