

# Skill Finder marks one year with over 3000 unique courses and 75,000 enrolments

**SYDNEY, Australia – 23 November, 2021 –** Skill Finder, the digital micro-skills marketplace developed by the Australian tech industry, is celebrating its one year anniversary with 3,000+ digitally-focused courses, and more than 75,000 course enrolments completed.

Led by Adobe and built and managed by <u>Balance Internet</u>, Skill Finder was established in response to a call for action from Karen Andrews, the then Federal Minister for Industry, Science and Technology. Andrews challenged the tech sector in March 2020 to step up, take action and support post-pandemic economic recovery. Today Skill Finder partners with over 30 technology and education providers, 2.5 times more collaborators than when it was launched in late 2020.

"Skill Finder was the first collaboration of its kind, where major tech companies came together to focus on supporting Australia's economic recovery by upskilling the nation," said Suzanne Steele, Vice President and Managing Director of Adobe Australia and New Zealand.

"Digital experiences have never played a more critical role in making every aspect of our lives possible – from keeping families and coworkers connected, to enabling new ways of learning, to powering digital commerce, and ensuring continuity of essential business operations. Australia's future prosperity will depend on us driving and enabling a thriving digital economy, and this will involve the upskilling and reskilling of many of our workforce," said Steele.

One year from launch, Skill Finder has attracted more than 300,000 Australians to the site and now offers more than 3,000 free digital courses and micro-skills, up from the 700 courses available at launch. Importantly, more than 75,000 course enrolments have been completed by Australians looking to reskill or upskill in areas such as graphic design, cloud computing, data analysis and management, digital marketing, security, UX design, and many more.

Minister for Superannuation, Financial Services and the Digital Economy Jane Hume said digital skills are critical to ensuring Australia becomes a leading digital economy and society by 2030.

"Digital skills are vital to our recovery and job creation post COVID-19. Around 60 per cent of workers will need higher-level digital skills, but all future jobs will need basic digital capabilities.

"The Morrison Government is prioritising this skill shortage area, ensuring that Australians can meet business demand for these valuable skills. Initiatives like Skill Finder empower Australians to up-skill to meet demand, helping them get jobs they aspire to. You can always trust the Morrison Government to create more jobs, and this initiative does just that," said Minister Hume.

To expand its reach and influence, over the past 12-months Skill Finder has developed a number of strategic partnerships including with the Commonwealth Bank, to integrate Skill Finder into its Benefits finder feature in CommBank's business and personal banking apps. Skill Finder is also partnering with the Digital Skills Organisation (DSO), developing a proof of concept – SkillUp – which will help employers assess the digital fluency of its employees and connect them to relevant courses.

"Skill Finder was born from a vision to empower all Australians and businesses, regardless of size, to build the professional, technical and digital skills they need to upskill or find employment," said James Horne, Chief Executive Officer at Balance Internet. "I am so proud that we are on the road to achieving this. The unique collaboration of leading tech companies has underpinned Skill Finder's success, now and for the future."

Through ongoing new partnerships and providers, Skill Finder has continued to build out new functionalities and features, including <u>20 Career Pathways</u> to help Australians understand the skills and knowledge required in an area of specialisation before they pivot or start their career.

In May 2021, Skill Finder also received <u>a \$2.7 million grant from the Australian Government</u> to support its further development, impact and reach.
