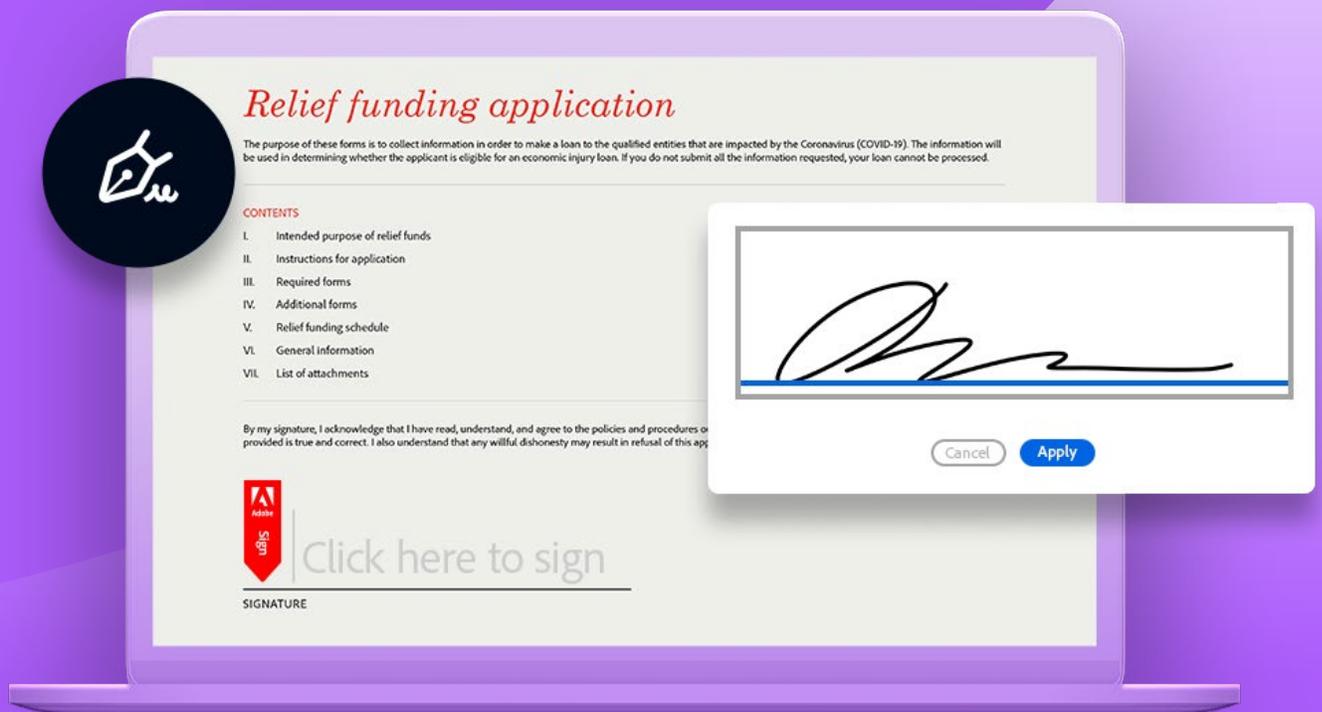


The road map to service continuity.

Government uninterrupted.

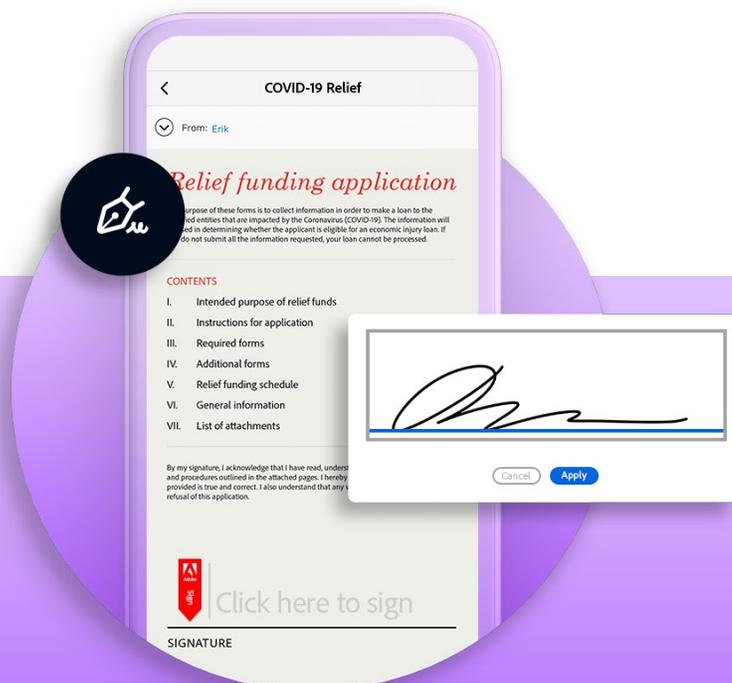
Over the last few years, government agencies have embraced cloud technologies as a way to increase efficiencies and reduce overhead costs. Most employees didn't have remote access to work computers and software from home. They could no longer just walk out of their cubicle to get an approval signature or solicit feedback.

Printing and scanning became major obstacles. Suddenly, nice-to-have digital solutions became urgent necessities.

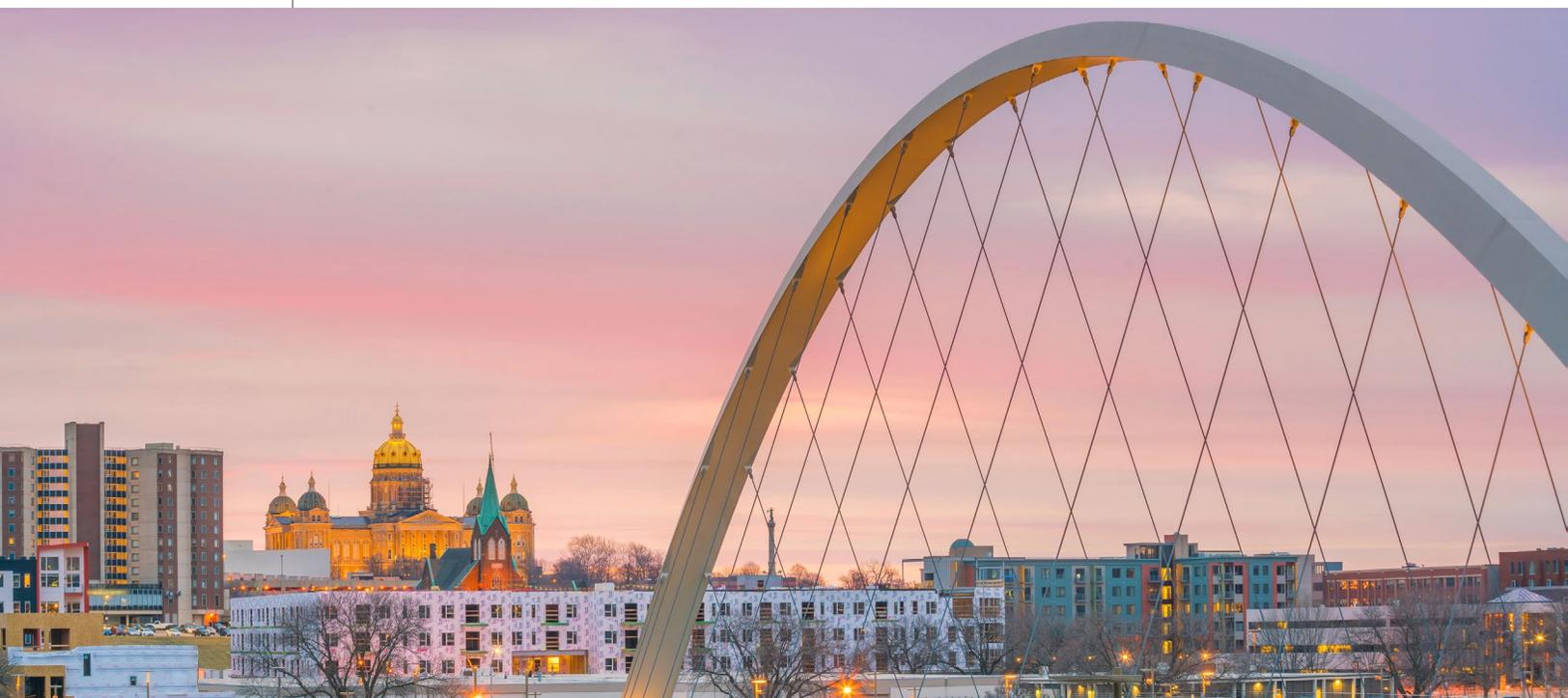
Give people self-service power— from start to finish.

Most public-facing forms have to be downloaded, and then mailed or faxed to an office.

Quickly turn existing paper and PDF forms into smart, fully digital [web forms](#)—reducing processing time from days to mere minutes.

Agencies are prioritizing critical agency services such as small-business relief programs and unemployment assistance. Using smart, mobile-friendly digital forms instead of downloadable files lets constituents fill, sign, and submit applications online. Back-end workflow processes route the information from there. Program managers can send personalized responses and ask for additional signatures in batch mode to handle high-volume requests. Employees and constituents alike get notified as progress is made.

The State of Iowa stood up a new web form application in less than two days, which delivered \$52 million in financial relief to small businesses in three weeks.

Route internal work faster by ditching paper.

Internal inefficiencies get a lot trickier with remote work, especially in areas like accounting, legal, human resources, and project management that are heavily reliant on paper.

Embrace electronic signatures and document routing.

In a government setting, contracts, invoices, purchase orders, and plans must be reviewed by multiple people before they are finalized. Compliance regulations require some plans and documents to be stored and archived for years, taking up valuable real estate, and requiring complex cataloging and retention procedures. Moving to [electronic documents](#) and signatures frees up a significant amount of employee time, cuts overhead costs, and creates a better citizen experience.



The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) was able to fix roads faster by getting change orders approved in 3 days instead of 30.
